### MORE INFORMATION ABOUT THE ANNUAL COUNCIL MEETING

There are three Council long stay car parks within a short walking distance of the theatre: New Cut Extension TR15 1AF – which has 54 spaces and costs £4.70 for 24 hours; West End TR15 3AD – which has 85 spaces and costs £2.50 for 24 hours; and Flowerpot Chapel TR15 2AE – which has 128 spaces and costs £4.70 for 24 hours. In addition, there is a private car park run by UK Car Parks, Fair Meadow Car Park (Old Cattle Market) Station Road/Clinton Passage TR15 2AY – this has 145 spaces and costs £2 for 3-12 hours; a small private pay and display car park at St Rumons, Penryn Street TR15 2SP – this has 40 spaces; and Redruth Station TR15 2AB – this has 30 spaces, the daily rate is £3.60 (£2.20 after 10am)

The coaches will drop members off at the short stay car park behind the Regal Theatre, a two-minute walk through a walkway onto Fore Street.

The Regal Theatre is offering a pre-ordered packed lunch for £8 which will include a choice of sandwich, a packet of crisps, bar of chocolate, fruit and a bottle of water. Hot drinks will be available to purchase on the day. Packed lunches may be eaten in the auditorium. Order forms will be sent to members with their tickets after the closing date of 31st August. Please send completed orders directly to the Regal Theatre, not to Chy Noweth. The Regal Theatre has a bar/coffee shop and, in addition to this, there are a number of cafés and coffee shops, several with outside seating. 
